

Everybody Plays! • Community Foundation Giving Fund
\$15,000 was secured to provide low-income families an opportunity to participate in recreational programs.

Senior Programs • Barnery Trust and Hogg Fund
\$30,323 was allocated to the Rudy Luepke Senior Center.

Community Gardens • City of Vancouver
Vancouver-Clark Parks and Recreation's community gardens program received \$5,100 to fund the addition of one new community garden at Haagen Community Park and introduce neighborhood food gardens in several neighborhood parks.

Abrams Park • City of Ridgefield
Ridgefield received \$4,515 for its Abrams Park Gee Creek Trail Improvement Project which will provide a defined route and surface, enabling the community to enjoy the natural beauty of Abrams Park and Gee Creek in Ridgefield.

Everybody Plays! • City of Vancouver
The Parks Foundation awarded \$8,000 to Vancouver-Clark Parks and Recreation's Everybody Plays! Scholarship program which allows under served families and individuals access to fee-based classes and activities they would not normally be able to afford.

Traveling Summer Playground • City of Battle Ground
The Battle Ground Parks & Recreation Department was awarded \$4,000 for its inaugural season of the 2009 Traveling Summer Playground Program. This 10 week free summer program brought recreation programs directly to six local neighborhoods, making the program very accessible, affordable and FUN! Over 1300 children participated in arts and crafts projects, games, sports, mini events and storytelling.

Skateboard Park • City of Ridgefield
The City of Ridgefield was awarded \$2,000 for the purchase of new skateboard equipment for the Ridgefield Community Park. A new picnic table designed specifically for skateboarding gives kids a change to test their skills and focus their energy in a positive way.

Trail Building • City of Washougal
The Parks Foundation provided \$1,200 to the City of Washougal to support the April 18, 2009 Mable Kerr Trail Building Day. The event, which welcomed approximately 75 volunteers to the trail site, included the removal of invasive weeds, planting more than 500 new trees, and spreading of gravel.
